Care Enabling People St Cuthbert's Care

Welcome to the Work of St Cuthbert's Care

St Cuthbert's Care is one of the longest-established regional charities in the North East. Founded in 1946 by the Catholic Church, its original aim was to offer food and shelter to disadvantaged families, particularly orphaned children from World War II.

Now, over 70 years on, St Cuthbert's Care employs around 280 people and works across the whole of the north east region helping the most vulnerable members of our communities. Our work is specialised and often tackles areas of unmet need that are either unattractive or considered to be too high risk for other providers. We focus largely upon:

- Residential care for children
- Short and long-term fostering
- Specialist provision for people with profound disabilities
- Care for older people

Much of our work is sensitive and emotive, reaching deep into people's lives. We engage and contract with a range of professional bodies and local authorities and this income pays for the full cost of our care, including overheads.

In addition to our care provision we develop and run community projects. These span our region, targeting people who have absolutely nothing and supporting people who need the company and compassion of others. Our fundraised income and donations pay for the entire cost of our community work.

In the summary of our work that follows, our Purpose, *working for the common good by enabling people to develop to their personal potential* is the tenet that underpins everything we do. It is why people are at the heart of our work and why they will always remain so.

Residential Care for Children

This is the most challenging area of our work. Sadly there are cases where children and young people are subjected to the most appalling levels of systematic abuse and neglect in their own homes.

For many children, removal from the family home to a foster family or, in extreme cases, to residential care is essential for

their wellbeing and the only remaining safe option.

However difficult the circumstances, there is possibly no greater trauma for a child to overcome than that of being removed from their family home.

Our residential homes provide long-term safety and stability for our younger children, and for our older children they provide a platform from which to prepare for further education, work and independent living.

As one of the largest and most successful private providers of children's residential care in our region, we have helped scores of young people over the years to work towards lives filled with purpose and aspiration.

We invest continually in the care and personal development of each child and also in the physical environment of our homes.

We currently operate three *Auton* homes, the name the charity uses for its provision of residential care for children. These are located in Sunderland, Darlington and Newcastle. The brand has become synonymous with quality guardianship, as reaffirmed in one of our *Auton* home's Ofsted reports which commented: "Overall this home provides an outstanding quality of care and staff excel at promoting improved outcomes for the young people."

Fostering North East

The charity has its own registered fostering agency, *Fostering North East*, which operates across the region. With a pool of approved and experienced foster families, *Fostering North East* provides quality, short and long-term foster provision to children of all ages.

Through *Fostering North East*, children and young people of all ages in need of a loving home, are carefully matched with new families that offer nurturing, stability and understanding.

Our highly experienced and specialist team of qualified social workers ensures that both foster child and carer receive all the support and advice needed to guarantee a successful and happy foster placement.

Demand for fostering has grown considerably over the past few years and St Cuthbert's Care continues to recruit and support new carers to join their team.

Specialist Services for People with Profound Disabilities

For some families, coping with a profoundly disabled loved one is an immutable struggle of exhaustion and discrimination that can often be debilitating and isolating.

St Cuthbert's Care recognises these demands and has responded by developing a wide range of services for people with disabilities, their families and carers.

Today, the charity's provision includes:

- Residential short breaks for adults with complex disabilities
- Longer-term, specialist residential accommodation for adults with complex disabilities and behaviours
- A permanent residential home for people with learning disabilities
- A number of services to support people with disabilities to live independently in their own home
- Day resources for disabled adults to develop skills to become better equipped for everyday living, with a particular focus on social interaction
- A specialist therapeutic and leisure activity centre for disabled people and their families which is completely free of charge

The charity is delighted to have the on-going and active support of patron and football star, Alan Shearer. The Alan Shearer Foundation, led by Alan, provides a dedicated fundraising arm to enable the charity to continue to develop Alan's namesake disability service: The Alan Shearer Centre.

As part of St Cuthbert's Care, the Foundation's purpose is to:

- Offer a number of free short breaks at the Alan Shearer Short Break Centre
- Continue to support and further develop the free facilities at the Alan Shearer Activity Centre
- Enable St Cuthbert's Care to expand and develop its disability provision and reach across the North East.
